## Pastor's Message by the Rev. Joyce Rich

### An Epiphany

I think one of the best things about January is Epiphany. We're fortunate to have Epiphany not only as an important day on the church calendar, but as an example of what new insights and understandings can happen through an 'epiphany' on our faith journey.

Whether they were wise men, astrologers, kings, or simply curious people able to put enough resources together for an open ended road trip, they chose to "follow the star" that they believed marked the birth of a new king. Quite a birth announcement! Quite an undertaking to set out on a camel caravan to validate their assessment of the rising of a new star! Quite a mistake to show up at Herod's palace in Jerusalem asking to meet the new king! Quite confusing to be told to point the camels toward Bethlehem! Quite astounding to reach a far less than palatial place! And these travelers who have come all this way looking for a new king, why they end up meeting Jesus and Mary!

The travelers had an epiphany in Bethlehem. It came to them that their trip wasn't just about acknowledging and celebrating a royal birth. In the Gospel of Matthew it says, "they were overwhelmed with joy."

On our faith journeys it can seem like we just keep traveling, and perhaps we've forgotten where it is we're headed to, or maybe it seems like we're never getting any closer to God, or that God isn't with us – and then somewhere along the way we have an epiphany. We may be "overwhelmed with joy" because we suddenly see where God has been with us! Or it may just come to us that we've received an answer to our prayers, that God has been at work for some time, and we're just now seeing it. Or maybe our hearts feel strangely warmed, and we understand that God truly does love us, forgives us, and is with us.

And because of our epiphany, our steps are surer, our vision is clearer, and our hearts are filled with joy.

The annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity for 2011 is January 18-25. The theme chosen for 2011 is "One in the apostles' teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread and prayer" (cf. Acts 2:42). Throughout 2011, join Christians everywhere in praying "that they may all be one" joining our prayer with that of the Lord Jesus Christ. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity was first observed at Graymoor in Garrison, New York, from January 18-25, 1908. Today, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity invites the whole Christian community throughout the world to pray in communion with the prayer of Jesus "that they all may be one" (*John 17:21*).

With Christians of the Holy Land, we too are witnesses to the birth of Jesus Christ in Bethlehem, his ministry in Galilee, his death and resurrection, and the descent of the Holy Spirit in Jerusalem; when we yearn for peace and justice for all in the sure and certain hope of your coming Kingdom, Triune One who makes us one, make our unity visible and bring healing to the world.

Then, by rebate check in early 2011, any of your church's registrations will be reduced to \$15.00, and the difference will be sent back to you.
